#1 | CDR Brian C. Kesselring, USN Flight Leader, Commanding Officer, Blue Angels

It's our pleasure to introduce you to the Blue Angels Flight Leader, Commander Brian C. Kesselring who lead the 2020 Blue Angels Flight Demonstration Squadron. Commander Kesselring will be our February dinner speaker.

Brian is a native of Fargo, North Dakota. He graduated from Concordia College, MN, where he earned a Bachelor of Arts undergraduate degree with majors in Physics, Mathematics, and Business while also competing in basketball and track & field. Upon graduation, Brian attended Officer Candidate School in Pensacola, Florida, where he earned his commission as an Ensign in the U.S. Navy in March 2001.



Brian was designated a Naval Aviator in August 2003, and received orders to the "Gladiators" of Strike Fighter Squadron (VFA) 106 at Naval Air Station (NAS) Oceana, Virginia, for F/A-18C Hornet training. His first fleet assignment was as a member of the "Gunslingers" of VFA-105, where he flew the F/A-18C and F/A-18E and completed two combat deployments aboard USS Harry S. Truman (CVN 75) in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom. He was then selected to attend the Navy Fighter Weapons School (TOPGUN), where he remained as a staff instructor from 2008-2011.

Upon completing his tour at TOPGUN, Brian reported to the "Tophatters" of VFA-14 at NAS Lemoore, California, where he served as the Training Officer and deployed aboard USS John C. Stennis (CVN 74) in support of Operation New Dawn and Operation Enduring Freedom. Following his Training Officer tour, Brian reported to the "Tomcatters" of VFA-31 as a Department Head, where he deployed aboard the USS George H.W. Bush (CVN 77) in support of Operation Enduring Freedom and Operation Inherent Resolve. During his tour with the "Tomcatters," he was honored to receive the "LCDR Michael Longhardt" award for superior leadership.

Brian then received orders to Carrier Air Wing One as Assistant Operations Officer where

he deployed aboard the USS Theodore Roosevelt (CVN 71) in support of Operation Inherent Resolve. Following this tour, Brian reported to the Naval War College earning a Master of Arts in National Security Strategy, while participating in the Halsey Advanced Research Program.

Brian was then assigned as the Executive Officer of the "Sunliners" of VFA-81 in March 2017, subsequently assuming Command in June 2018 and deploying aboard USS Harry S. Truman (CVN 75) in support of Operation Inherent Resolve. While serving as Commanding Officer, the "Sunliners" were honored to receive the Navy's coveted "Battle Effectiveness" award.

Brian joined the Blue Angels in September 2019. He has accumulated more than 3,900 flight hours and has 812 carrier-arrested landings. His decorations include the Meritorious Service Medal, six Strike/Flight Air Medals, three Navy and Marine Corps Commendation Medals, two Navy and Marine Corps Achievement Medals, and various personal, unit and service awards.

We look forward to having you join us as we host the Blue Angels officers next Tuesday, February 4, 2020. We'll have an early start time of 5:30 p.m.

Blue Angels Arrive for Winter Training



You've likely heard the roar of F/A-18's Hornets flying overhead our Valley. The Blue Angels arrived from Pensacola, Florida on Thursday, January 3rd to begin their 74th year of entertaining airshow spectators, and inspiring our youth to Naval and Marine Corps aviation.

For the next 10 weeks, the 130 members of the flight demonstration squadron will call the Imperial Valley "home" as they perfect their program for their upcoming airshow season. This will be the final season where the Blue Angels will showcase the F/A-18C Hornet before they transition to the newer F/A-18E/F Super Hornet for the 2021 season.

Modifications to the Super Hornet are underway for the long-awaited transition, and the


Blue Angels' 2020 show season has been shortened to enable ample time for the transition to a new platform.

The Blue Angels are scheduled to received 11 Super Hornets -- 9 of which are aircraft that have spent their lives as test aircraft or were in storage after returning from the fleet; and two two-seater jets.

Both the Blue Angels and Naval Air Facility have preliminarily announced their 2021 airshow schedule to which will begin on April 10, 2021 in Jacksonville instead of El Centro.

NAF El Centro is set to rebrand their 2021 airshow as a "Festival of Flight" which will feature a Blue Angels practice demonstration in the Super Hornet.

At a change of command ceremony on Friday, January 24, 2020, Captain Brent Alfonzo was relieved of command in a retirement ceremony, and Captain Derrick Kinsley assumed command as the 38th commanding officer of the facility since its inception in 1946.

Captain Kingsley is a native of Granite City, Illinois and a 1996 graduate of the United States Naval Academy. Designated a Naval Aviator in 1998, he reported to the Helicopter Anti-Submarine Squadron FIVE "Night Dippers" in September 1999, flying the SH-60F and HH-60H out of NAS Jacksonville, FL. During this tour, he deployed with Carrier Air Wing

SEVEN aboard USS DWIGHT D. EISENHOWER (CVN 69) in support of OPERATION SOUTHERN WATCH, as well as USS JOHN F. KENNEDY (CV 67) in support of OPERATION ENDURING FREEDOM.

In January 2003, Captain Kingsley reported for shore duty to the Helicopter Anti-Submarine Squadron TEN "War Hawks" aboard NAS North Island. At HS-10, he became qualified Instructor Pilot in all mission areas. During the time, he also earned a Master of Science Degree from the University of San Diego.

Captain Kingsley reported to USS BOXER (LHD 4) aboard Naval Station San Diego in June 2005, serving as the Safety Officer and Officer of the Deck.

In July 2007, Captain Kingsley reported for a department head assignment with HS-5 "Night Dippers", serving as Administrative Officer, Operations Officer, and Maintenance Officer. During this tour, he again deployed with Carrier Air Wing SEVEN aboard USS DWIGHT D. EISENHOWER (CVN 69) in support of OPERATION ENDURING FREEDOM.

Following this tour, Captain Kingsley reported as the Assistant Officer in Charge of Commander Helicopter Sea Combat Wing Atlantic Daetachment Jacksonville. In January 2010, he detached onboard USS CARL VINSON (CVN 70) in support of OPERATION UNIFIED RESPONSE in the Bay of Haiti. Captain Kingsley reported to Helicopter Sea Combat Squadron THREE aboard NAS North Island in July 2010, qualifying as an MH-60S Instructor Pilot. Following his transition to the MH-60S, Captain Kingsley served with distinction as the HSC-3 Executive Officer from May 2011 until June 2012. In June 2012, he became the Executive Officer for the HSC-8 "Eightballers" and completed an eightmonth deployment with the USS JOHN C. STENNIS Strike Group in support of OPERATION ENDURING FREEDOM. From September 2013, to December 2014, Captain Kingsley commanded the "Eightballers"- leading them through 11 highly successful detachments and various inspections. Following his operational Command at Sea tour, CAPT Kingsley worked as the Chief of Naval Operations Plans and Policy Deputy Branch Head and lead Action Officer for the Strategic Laydown and Dispersal portfolio from January 2015 – January 2018. CAPT Kingsley reported to the Joint Staff (J35) in January 2018 where he served as the Chief of Operations for the National Military Command Center. From September 2018, until December 2019, CAPT Kingsley served as the Chief of Staff for the Director of Operations (J3).
